LEE E. JURRAS -Editor and Publisher

Lee E. Jurras is founder and President of the Super Vel Cartridge Corporation, co-founder of the "Outstanding American Handgunner Awards" Program, Charter Member of Indiana Chapter, Safari Club International, Business Member International Profesional Hunters Association, Charter Life Member of Hunting Hall of Fame Foundation and Endowment Member of the NRA.

Lee has taken nearly 100 head of medium and large game with a hand-gun from Alaska to Africa. In addition to his activities in the handgun hunting field, the largest portion of his livlihood is derived from ballistics research in handguns and handgun ammo.

MAJOR GEORGE C. NONTE - Technical Editor

George is a retired Army Ordnance Officer, consultant and handgun specialist. Among his peers, George is probably considered the most knowledgeable when it comes to the care and feeding, idiosyncracies and modifications of the handgun. He has authored over a dozen books and is a staff member of several publications.

KENT LOMONT -Field Testing


Kent is a chemical engineer for the Eaton Corporation of Fort Wayne, Indiana. He started custom loading for handguns at the age of 9, and got his first .44 Super Blackhawk at the age of 11. By age 16, Kent owned and was testing over 300 big bore handguns.

Lomont has assembled about every available combination of propellants and projectiles fired in big bore handguns. With both scoped and unscoped handguns, Kent has fired nearly one million rounds of .44 Mag ammo. To date, he has test fired approximately forty-five thousand rounds in both the .357 and .44 AMP cartridge.

HARRY SANFORD -Technical Advisor

In 1968, Harry designed the Auto Mag pistol and his patent was issued in 1973. In addition to designing various cartridges, Harry holds other patents in the firearms industry.

An avid big game hunter, Harry is a Charter Member of the Los Angeles Chapter, Safari Club International. He is founder of the California Big Horn Sheep Society and is a Life Member of the NRA. In addition to having his grand slam on sheep, he took the second largest grizzly in the Continental U.S.



L.E. Jurras Custom 100 - .357 Auto Mag Now Available!

L. E. Jurras, international handgun hunter and President of Super Vel Cartridge Corp., commissioned T.D.E. CORP., El Monte California, to manufacture a special, limited-edition model of the Auto Mag pistol to his specifications. This gun, as revised by Jurras, represents what he considers the epitome of modern hunting handguns, possessing the optimum values in velocity and flat trajectory, power, accuracy, recoil, handling and reliability.

This model will be designated and marked "L. E. JURRAS, CUSTOM MODEL 100" and production will be limited to 100 units in .357 AMP caliber. It will feature 6½-inch ribbed barrel, Mag-Na-Port muzzle modification, adjustable open sights, custom grips of contrasting woods and presentation case.

The standard "L. E. JURRAS, CUSTOM MODEL 100" with 6½-inch barrel is priced \$487.50. Guns carrying Serial Number LEJ 080 through LEJ 090 inclusive, will have the 8½-inch unribbed barrel and will be available at an additional cost of \$25.00.

Custom .44 AMP Commissioned

Because of the tremendous interest generated by the mention of the possible commissioning of a custom .44 AMP in last month's issue of the Super Vel Newsletter, I've commissioned T.D.E. to build 100 guns with matching serial numbers. Those individuals whose deposit has been received on the .357 AMP, naturally, have 1st choice of matching serial numbers on the .44 AMP.

Like most other commodities during the past year, there was a price increase on these guns between the commissioning of the .357 AMP's and .44 AMP's.

The standard $6\frac{1}{2}$ -inch ribbed barrel .44 AMP's will sell for \$499.50, and the $8\frac{1}{2}$ -inch un-ribbed barrel for \$524.50.



Rotary Bolt



NOTES TO .357 AMP HANDLOADERS

When ordering your RCBS dies for necking the "C.D.M." .44 AMP cases to .357 AMP, suggest you order your expander plug .352 inch diameter for use with .356 inch bullets. This allows for virtually no expanding, but only belling the case mouth enough to start the bullet, yet give the required bullet to case marriage. When the "C.D.M." .44 AMP case is necked to .357 AMP. it will require a case trimming of .008 inch to .012 inch to maintain the proper case length. DO NOT neck ream this "C.D.M." case, just the necessary chamfering inside and outside the case mouth. Recommend the new RCBS case trimmer, if you do not already have one. This technique is for use with the "C.D.M." .44 AMP cases only.

Those of you who use the 308 case, follow instructions as given in your RCBS 44-357 AMP case forming die sets. The .352 inch diameter expanded will still be adequate for use with our .355 inch 80 and 90 grain bullets for those speed enthusiasts who want 3,000 f.p.s. for varmint hunting.



Kent Lomont, of Lomont Precision Bullets, Fort Wayne, IN, tells me he is getting 3,000 f.p.s. plus with our 80 gr. JHP bullet, and 3½ inch groups at 100 yards. More info on this later, after I have personally run pressure tests.

Due to the lead time required by C.D.M. to manufacture 357 and 44 AMP cases to our specs, the first ammo available from Super Vel will carry the C.D.M. Headstamp.
